- Seal windows and doors: Fill in any gaps with weatherstripping or caulking to stop moisture from getting in.
- Check for plumbing leaks: Inspect under sinks, around toilets, and behind appliances for any signs of leaks.
- Monitor indoor humidity levels: Use a dehumidifier or ensure good ventilation, especially in bathrooms, kitchens, and basements.
- Watch for condensation: If you notice excessive moisture on windows or walls, it could indicate poor ventilation or hidden leaks.

- Grade landscaping away from your home: Sloped soil helps direct rainwater away from your foundation.
- Consider installing French drains:

 These underground pipes help steer water away from your home.
- Check your foundation: Repair any small cracks before they increase in size.
- Maintain exterior paint and siding: Peeling or cracked paint can allow moisture to seep in.
- Inspect sprinkler systems: Make sure they aren't spraying directly against your home's walls or foundation.
